- Explore the history of the old 'ghost' town of Silverton, visit the Mad Max Museum and optional art galleries, and enjoy light lunch at the Silverton Hotel.
- Guided tour of the historic copper mining heritage town of Burra.

### **HUGHES TRANSFERS TO AND FROM YOUR HOME:**

Hughes transfers apply in the zoned area. These transfers may be available at additional cost to passengers who live outside the zoned area - please ask your King William Travel consultant.

'HUGHES HOME PICK UP SERVICE' will call you **(2) working days** before the commencement of the tour to confirm the time they will be arriving at your home. If you have missed the call, please contact Hughes 24 hours prior to departure on **8440 0766**. ***If you are resident at a retirement village, please ensure Hughes have clear instructions from you as to means of entry and directions to your home.***

**Also, if you are out of zone you will be advised of the additional payment due and this should be made direct to the driver on the day of travel.**

Hughes home transfers are based on **4 persons to a car**. (numbers in a vehicle may vary according to type of vehicle used). In order to accommodate 4 persons and their baggage, suitcases should measure no more than **64cms in height** when standing on end.

Baggage larger than 64cms will result in a surcharge of **\$10.00 per person in each direction**, payable to the driver on the day of travel.

The Hughes home pick up service only applies to scheduled tour departure and return tour dates. Those passengers wishing to extend their tours will be responsible for their own transfers.

### **NOTES:**

***Health and Fitness: To assist us when booking, please advise your King William Travel consultant if you have any special needs such as mobility, dietary etc. A minimum level of fitness is required in order to be able to participate. You will need to be able to walk up a flight of stairs and manage coach steps unaided and you must inform us before the commencement of the tour of any medical condition which may affect your ability to participate in the tour. If you are unable to manage on your own, it will be necessary to be accompanied by another person who is fit and able to assist you in day to day tasks and capable of providing the assistance required. Dietary requests must be accompanied by the appropriate dietary information in writing.***

***It should be noted to be fair to all passengers, specific seats cannot be reserved.***



### **DAY 1 – MONDAY - ADELAIDE/BROKEN HILL**

Depart at **7.30am** from the **Adelaide Central Bus Station at 85 Franklin Street** on your luxury air-conditioned and seat belt equipped coach. Our journey takes us through the mid North of South Australia via Peterborough, crossing into NSW at Cockburn with a lunch stop at Yunta (own cost). Mid-afternoon we arrive at the **Ibis Styles in Broken Hill**, our home for the next 3 nights, where there will be time to settle in before enjoying **dinner** in the hotel.

**DAY 2 – TUESDAY - AT BROKEN HILL - MORNING CITY TOUR – PRO HART GALLERY, BROKEN HILL MINT AND THE ‘BIG PICTURE,’ ROYAL FLYING DOCTOR SERVICE, WHITE’S MINERAL ART GALLERY AND MINING MUSEUM, LINE OF LODE MINERS’ MEMORIAL**



After breakfast at the hotel, we commence a **tour** of the unique and historic **‘Silver City,’ Broken Hill**. We will see some of the original houses, also the well-presented parks and gardens, beautifully kept churches and historic buildings.

Our first visit will be to the famous **Pro Hart Gallery** to view a collection of the late artist’s work, from paintings and sketches of life in the outback to some extraordinary sculptures, the gallery has it all.

Visit the **Silver City Mint and Art Centre** where we view the **‘Big Picture,’** painted by artist **Peter Anderson**. This is the world’s largest acrylic painting on canvas, measuring 100m x 12m and is a truly amazing panorama of Broken Hill and its history. Our next stop is at the **Royal Flying Doctor Service** located at Broken Hill Airport. Spend a most interesting hour, watching a film giving an overview of the Royal Flying Doctor Service in operation, then view the aircraft in the hangar. Marvel at the old equipment and learn from the new interpretive displays.

After our lunch break, (own cost), rejoin our coach and head off to **White’s Mineral Art Gallery and Mining Museum**. This is no ordinary art gallery - the gallery is set out as a mining stope and features a superb collection of crushed mineral collage art works depicting mining past and present, legends and local historic buildings, all the work of our genial and informative host, **Kevin ‘Bushy’ White**. You may also wish to enjoy a quiet drink across the road from the hotel at the iconic **Palace Hotel** (own cost), which started life as a temperance coffee house back in the 1880’s, but quickly became a pub - and the location for scenes from the iconic movie ‘Priscilla Queen of the Desert.’

Late afternoon we head up to the **Line of Lode Miners’ Memorial**, a dramatic, iconic structure on the edge of the giant mullock heap which dissects Broken Hill which commemorates the 800+miners who lost their lives working on the Broken Hill Mines. Tonight enjoy **dinner** at the nearby **Barrier Social Democratic Club (‘The Demo’)**.

**DAY 3 – WEDNESDAY - AT BROKEN HILL – BROKEN HILL REGIONAL ART GALLERY & THE 99<sup>th</sup> ARCHIBALD PRIZE EXHIBITION, OLD ‘GHOST’ TOWN OF SILVERTON – MAD MAX MUSEUM, GALLERIES, SILVERTON HOTEL, BROKEN HILL SCULPTURE SYMPOSIUM**

This morning our first stop will be at the **Broken Hill Regional Art Gallery** to view the fabulous 99<sup>th</sup> **Archibald Prize Exhibition**. See superb portraits of many people, famous and not so well known - including the self-portrait by actor **Mayne Wyatt**, winner of the **Packing Room Prize** and the overall winner **Vincent Namatjira** (great-grandson of the famous Indigenous artist **Albert Namatjira**), with his painting of himself with football star Adam Goodes entitled “Stand Strong For Who You Are.” Later, we head out of town, 25kms north-west of Broken Hill to the little town of **Silverton**. Once a thriving community of more than 1700, it is now virtually a ghost town, however, today the town is popular with both film-makers and tourists.

Visit the **Mad Max Museum** – Australia’s first and only museum dedicated to ‘Mad Max 2,’ with items displayed in such a way they tell the story of the film. See life-size characters in full costume from the movie, original and replica vehicles, from the movie. Enjoy free time to visit some of the wonderful galleries such as The Horizon Gallery and 39 Dips up on the hill and pay a visit to the historic **Silverton Hotel** where we will enjoy a **light lunch**.



Our final visit for the day will be out to the fascinating **Broken Hill Sculpture Symposium**, located within the Living Desert, high above the saltbush-studded plains. The Symposium was completed in 1993 by artists from around the world, under the direction of organiser and artist Lawrence Beck. View the 12 sandstone sculptures which highlight the horizon as we enjoy the magnificent surrounding view.

**Dinner** this evening will be at the well-renowned **Mulga Hill Tavern**.

#### **DAY 4 – THURSDAY - BROKEN HILL/ADELAIDE VIA BURRA AND CLARE – TOUR OF BURRA**

After breakfast we depart **Broken Hill** on our return journey to **Adelaide**. Our route takes us along the Barrier Highway to **Yunta** where we will make a morning tea stop at the roadhouse. (own cost). Then on to the lovely old copper mining heritage town of **Burra** where we will enjoy an interesting **1 hour guided tour** and a **light lunch** at the historic **Burra Hotel**. Continue cross country via Farrell to the picturesque mid-north wine town of **Clare** for a short stop, arriving **Adelaide Central Bus Station, 85 Franklin Street** at approximately **6.00pm**. (B,L)

A travel insurance claim for reimbursement should be submitted to the insurance company upon return home. It should be understood that neither King William Travel nor any subsidiary company or representative shall be liable for any loss, injury or damage arising from our services.

### ITINERARIES:

Itineraries are subject to change and no responsibility can be accepted. Coach operator and size of coach may be changed at the discretion of King William Travel without notice. Where a tour does not meet minimum numbers travelling together on the outward journey a cost surcharge will apply. If group numbers fall below 15 adult paying passengers no tour leader will be provided. No itemisation of tour arrangements can be given and no refund for any portion of a tour not taken. Flora and fauna as described in an itinerary is nature and as such cannot be guaranteed.

### ACCOMMODATION:

King William Travel reserves the right to alter hotel/motel accommodation and to substitute a suitable alternative. Where accommodation is booked on a 'will share basis,' at the time of finalisation if there is nobody suitable to share with, it may be necessary to pay the appropriate single supplement. King William Travel does not accept any responsibility for the non-compatibility of 'sharing' clients. If by choice a single room is requested and booked a single room surcharge will apply.

### FUEL SURCHARGES AND TAXES:

All bookings may attract additional fuel surcharges and taxes which can be levied up to and including the date of departure even if final payment has been made. Booking is subject to final audit.

### SECURITY DEPOSIT:

A non-refundable security deposit of **\$690.00 per person (inc GST)** is required within five (5 days) of booking.

### FINAL PAYMENTS:

The security deposit forms part of the total price, the balance of which is due 45 days prior to departure, or in the case of bookings made within that 45 day period, the final payment is due as soon as the booking is confirmed.

### LATE BOOKINGS AND AMENDMENTS:

Bookings made within 7 days inclusive of departure will incur a **late booking fee of \$75.00 per person**. Late bookings subject to availability. Once a booking has been made a **\$75.00 per person amendment fee** will apply for any alterations on selected departures only, and if applicable, one (1) change only to that booking. Transfers to other tours not permitted.

### CREDIT CARDS:

If paying by credit card, a surcharge applies of 2% for Visa and Mastercard and 3.5% for Amex and Diners cards.

### CANCELLATION CONDITIONS:

#### BOOKINGS CANCELLED AFTER THE FINAL PAYMENT HAS BEEN MADE:

- Bookings cancelled 46 days or earlier, full refund less deposit and booking fee and any other non-refundable services or products.
- Bookings cancelled 45 days or less prior to departure will incur a cancellation fee of 100% of the tour cost.
- No refund can be given for any portion of the tour not taken and no refund after the tour has commenced.



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
